Clothes Dryer Duct Booster® Presentation

The latest statistics from the **U.S. Fire Administration** cite that over 3,000 dryer vent fires occur annually, causing \$50 million in damages and resulting in 100 injuries and five deaths per year. What to do? Simply keep your dryer vent lint-free. Accumulated lint in dryer vents is the leading cause of dryer-related fires: 74% of all dryer fires result from excess lint build up.

Inadequate Exhaust Velocity Problems with Clothes Dryers:

- Excessive lint build-up
- Inflated Utility Bills due to long drying times
- Users wasting time waiting for longer than necessary Dryer Loads

Many Residential Dryers are rated for a maximum of 25-feet length of duct, plus two 90° elbows

Residential building trends now favor vertical termination

- Power Ventilator must be interlocked with Residential Dryer for automatic on/off operation
- Notification Panel must be provided to alert Dryer user to Power Ventilator Status

Multi-Family, Multi-story installations usually require an add-on ventilator due to length of ducts

- Individual Dryer Duct Ventilator every Dryer uses one
- Multiple Clothes Dryers on one Ventilator
- Commercial Clothes Dryers/Laundry
