Kitchen Ventilation – Meeting Codes and Standards

Presented by

Jessica Harrington

Jessica Harrington graduated with her bachelor's in mechanical engineering from the University of Delaware in 2014. She completed her master's in mechanical engineering at UD the following year, while working full time for DuPont in their Engineering Research and Development group. After two years at DuPont, Jessica left the lab to pursue a customer-facing technical sales role at Accurex. She has been with Accurex for two and half years and is currently the Executive Account Manager for Eastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware.

Jessica's presentation will discuss the codes and standards that are applicable to kitchen ventilation systems, including hoods, filters, grease duct, exhaust fans, make-up air and controls.

- Hood Types I and II: when to use and why.
- When and why to use different types of Type I hood configurations.
- Sizing hoods, what overhangs are required.
- UL710 allowances and how you are able to be exempt from certain sections of IMC requirements.
- Types of cooking appliances and how they are rated (light, medium, heavy, extra heavy duty).
- Determining exhaust airflow rates what to consider (IMC, UL, IECC, real life).
- Hood clearance to combustible requirements what to watch out for.
- Grease filters use and their application.
- Fire Suppression types and requirements.
- Grease duct requirements field fabrication versus prefabricated ductwork.
- Exhaust fan types applications and code requirement for accessories and clearances.
- Make-up air requirements for tempering and the types of supply fans available for use in kitchen ventilation.
- Control code requirements and the types of controls available to meet them.
- Constant volume controls versus variable volume (DCV).
- Demand Control Ventilation requirements as required per IECC and the use of electrically commutated motors (ECM).
